



BRISTOL

DESCRIPTION AND CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Leather is a natural product – each hide is unique and carries the natural characteristics of its origin, which will vary from hide to hide. As leather ages, it matures and develops a patina.

GENERAL

- Avoid direct sunlight on the leather.
- Avoid direct heat onto the leather.
- Avoid placing the leather next to a heat source.
- Dust and vacuum regularly to avoid a build-up of dust; if vacuuming, use a soft head attachment
- Wipe off stains and spills immediately with a clean, soft, lightly damp cloth, taking care not to soak the leather.
- Avoid being near any leather with any pen or ink.
- Do not use standard household cleaning products, as these may react with the finish, causing cracking.
- Do not use saddle soap or shoe polish on the leather.

BRISTOL

- Chrome-tanned cow hides aniline through dyed and nubuck-finished leather.
- The top surface is velvety in touch and effect, and it is created by sanding the leather with excellent paper.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- The velvet effect of this leather is called “nap,” which can be sealed, and the effect gets reduced on continuous use. A soft brush or sponge can rejuvenate it.
- This leather can quickly soil on upholstery. A suitable Nubuck cleaning product can be used to maintain this leather.
