LEATHER DESCRIPTION AND CARE INSTRUCTIONS

General Care Instructions

Leather is a natural product – each hide is unique and carries the natural characteristics of its natural origin, and these will vary from hide to hide. As leather ages, it matures and develops a patina.

General Care Guidelines

- Avoid direct sunlight on the leather.
 - Avoid direct heat on the leather.
 - Avoid placing the leather next to a heat source.
 - Dust and vacuum regularly to avoid a build-up of dust; if vacuuming, use a soft head attachment.
 - Wipe off stains and spills immediately with a clean, soft, lightly damp cloth, taking care not to soak the leather.
 - Avoid being near any leather with any type of pen or ink.
 - Do not use normal household cleaning products as these may react with the finish, causing cracking.
 - Do not use saddle soap or shoe polish on the leather.
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Hunter Leather

- Vegetable-tanned buffalo skins
- Drum dyed aniline leather with hard wax finish.
- This leather does not have any protection on top

CARE INSTRUCTIONS IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Hunter leather can show scratches or handling marks during use, which can be polished with suitable wax to remove them. Avoid any sharp objects in contact with this leather. Due to their tanning nature, these leathers can change color over time due to oxidation.
